Sunday, October 19th Jeremiah 31:27-34 or Genesis 32:22-31 / Psalm 119:97-104 or 121 / 2 Timothy 3:14–4:5 / Luke 18:1-8 (written by Denise)

Jeremiah 31:34 No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Several thoughts are flowing through me as I ponder this scripture. How loving, forgiving and amazing God is. He always meets each of us right where we are. Tuesday, October 21st Lamentations 1:1-5(6-9)10-12 / Psalm 26, 28 / 1 Corinthians 15:41-50 / Matthew 11:25-30 (written by Denise)

1 Corinthians 15:44 It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body.
