Sunday, October 5th Lamentations 1:1-6 or Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4 / Lamentations 3:19-26 or Psalm 137 or Psalm 37:1-10 / 2 Timothy 1:1-14 / Luke 17:5-10 (written by Denise)

Lamentations 3:22 Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassion never fails.

Matthew 9:9 And as Jesus passed forth from thence, he saw a man named Matthew, sitting at the receipt of custom: and he saith unto him, "Follow me," and he arose and followed him.
